

Welcome to Langley High School, Class of 2025 Parents and Guardians!! A new school year means lots of new information, which to be honest, can sometimes be a little overwhelming. How to Use This Guide

Below are the top priority to-do items to ease the transition to Langley and to stay informed throughout the high school years. Yes, it looks long, but it's possible to work through the steps rather quickly. (And, returning families, much of this may have been completed by you already in previous years.) We suggest setting aside some time now to rapidly work through each step, and then returning to the various resources to learn more at your leisure. You will find the information and resources in this guide in several other places. Our goal was to put it all in one place.

1. Sign up to receive important Class of 2025 emails ASAP.

If you haven't signed up in a previous year or your email has changed, you must OPT IN by clicking the link below and providing your email contact information in order to receive informative emails from your 2025 Class Parents. <u>Click or copy this link for Class of 2025 Parent Email Sign-Up.</u>

Then, be alert for 2025 Class Parent communications on the following upcoming parent events...

- Class of 2025 Parent Coffee -- Friday September 16 at 9:30 a.m., Langley Lecture Hall (Room 2600) Come connect with other parents and say hello to the Langley Administration in the Lecture Hall.
- Class Dinner (TBA Check the Class Webpage for updates.) This is the main Class of 2025 fundraiser. Class of 2025 students and their families are invited to meet senior LHS staff and other 2025 families. RVSP on MySchoolBucks.com once the date is released.
- Parent Forums (TBA) At Parent Forums you will receive information about upcoming Langley events and hear from various guest speakers on topics pertaining to your Class of 2025 student(s). Forums will be held in the LHS Lecture Hall (Room 2600) or virtually, if necessary.

2. Mark Your Calendars for these Key Dates:

- a. New Student Orientation Thursday, August 18, 9:00 a.m. New Langley students and parents welcome.
- b. First Day of School: August 22
- c. ***Deadline to Pay the Annual Class Activity Fee In Time to Receive a Spirit Week T-Shirt: August 22 (First Day of School)*** The \$35 annual Class Activity Fee is used for Spirit Week & Homecoming t-shirts --but ONLY for those who have paid their Activity Fee by August 22 -- and to fund activities such as Parent Forums and Student Treat Days, as well as fund future events like Prom and 2025 Graduation. Go to MySchoolBucks.com (School Payments, Browse All Items, Class of 2025 Activity Fee) to pay and select your student's t-shirt size. Because Homecoming is very early this year, the homecoming t-shirts have to be ordered early. Please pay the 2025 Activity Fee and select your student's t-shirt size by the August 22 deadline!
- d. Spirit Week & Homecoming: September 5-10. This is a week of Spirit Activities culminating with a pep rally and the Homecoming Football Game on Friday, and the Homecoming Dance on Saturday evening. Make sure your child listens to announcements on how to buy a Homecoming Dance ticket.

 NOTE: Class T-Shirts will be distributed during Spirit Week to be worn on 9/9 for students with their Annual Class Activity Fee paid by 8/22/22.
- e. Underclass Picture Days: Thursday, August 25 & Friday, August 26

3. Set up a MySchoolBucks account, if you don't already have one.

To make online payments for Class Activity Fee, Class Dinners, and Donations log onto MySchoolBucks.com. This is the same system used to add money to your child's cafeteria account and to pay other school expenses. If you need to add your child, just follow the easy prompts. Then, click on School Store at the top of the page. Donations are always appreciated!

SIS ParentVue provides parents with access to their child's grades and attendance 24/7. Quarterly report cards are posted in SIS. If you are new to FCPS, you will be provided a SIS activation key from FCPS. Once you receive it, please activate your SIS account here.

14. Bookmark the FCPS Schoology page.

Your Schoology Parent Account uses the same login credentials as your Parent SIS Account. A Schoology Parent Account gives you access to your child's classes, your child's upcoming assignments, and school, class, and group announcements. 15. Take the time to review and discuss Langley's Honor Code with your student.
